## ABOUT U KIANG NANGBAH

U Kiang Nangbah, a revered freedom fighter of Meghalaya, is a symbol of bravery, resilience, and patriotism. Born in the mid-19th century in Jowai, U Kiang Nangbah rose to prominence as a leader who opposed the oppressive policies of British colonial rule in the Jaintia Hills.

His resistance began as he led the indigenous people in their struggle to preserve their customs, traditions, and freedom. The British administration's imposition of heavy taxes, forced labor, and disrespect for local governance systems led to widespread discontent, and U Kiang Nangbah emerged as a unifying force among the Khasi-Pnar people.

In 1861, U Kiang Nangbah initiated a revolt against the British, inspiring his people to reclaim their sovereignty. Despite facing a superior and well-armed colonial force, his unwavering commitment to the cause ignited a spirit of resistance. His efforts culminated in several battles across the Jaintia Hills, showcasing his tactical brilliance and unyielding courage.

However, after a betrayal by informants, U Kiang Nangbah was captured by the British in December 1862. On December 30, 1862, he was executed publicly in Jowai. Before his execution, it is said he proclaimed a prophecy: ***"If my face turns eastward when I die, our land will be free; if it turns westward, we will remain enslaved."***

U Kiang Nangbah's martyrdom continues to inspire generations. His life embodies the values of courage, sacrifice, and love for one's culture and people. Kiang Nangbah Government College honors his legacy by instilling these values in its students, ensuring they carry forward his spirit of determination and pride in their heritage.

## ABOUT THE COLLEGE

Established in 1967, Kiang Nangbah Government College, the erstwhile "Jowai Government College" is a premier institution of higher education in the West Jaintia Hills District of Meghalaya.

Located in a vast and well-maintained campus conducive to academic activities, the College offers Courses in Arts (Day and Morning Sections), Science & Commerce (Day section only), and Integrated Teacher Education Programme (ITEP) for B.A.B.Ed & B.Sc.B.Ed.

The College campus contains a football field, two basketball courts, Indoor Stadium and a multipurpose hall which samples facilities to its students for extra-curricular activities. It has 14 Departments in all, with a staff strength of about 181 (117 Teaching and 64 support staff). The College at present caters to over 4000 students including the Morning Section.

Starting from a very humble origin, Kiang Nangbah Government College has striven and has grown into a multi-disciplinary institution. The Institution strives to provide affordable, quality education for all sections of society irrespective of caste, creed or religion.



## MANAGEMENT

## HISTORY OF THE ITEP DEPARTMENT

The journey of the Integrated Teacher Education Programme (ITEP) at Kiang Nangbah Government College (KNGC), Jowai, began on April 18, 2017, with the government appointing Shri Subrata De, then HoD of Physics at KNGC, as the first Principal of B.Ed. College, Mynthong, Jowai. The college became operational on the same day.

On December 6, 2018, the Government of Meghalaya notified the amalgamation of B.Ed. College, Mynthong with Kiang Nangbah Government College, Jowai thereby qualifying it as a multidisciplinary institution eligible to apply for ITEP.

The North Eastern Hill University (NEHU) granted provisional affiliation to KNGC on October 16, 2020, for the B.A.B.Ed and B.Sc.B.Ed programmes at the secondary stage. Finally on March 3, 2023, KNGC, Jowai, gets approval from NCTE, New Delhi to run the ITEP of B.A. B.Ed and B.Sc.B.Ed of one unit each from the academic year 2023–2024. KNGC was among the 42 institutions across India recognized in the first pilot phase of this NCTE initiative and is proud to be the first institution in Meghalaya to offer this transformative teacher education programme.

KNGC Admission to ITEP is through the National Common Entrance Test (NCET) conducted by the National Testing Agency (NTA). Candidates must select KNGC, Jowai, as their preferred choice in their online application form.

Internal Admission process was completed by October 5, 2023, and the induction programme for the selected candidates of the first batch was held on October 12, 2023.

The syllabus designed by NCTE got approved in toto by the North Eastern Hill University for implementation from the session 2023–2024. The official inauguration of the ITEP programme took place on September 17, 2024, by Shri Rakkam A Sangma, Honourable Minister of Education, Government of Meghalaya.

To support the effective launch of the programme, a hand-holding session was organized in collaboration with NCTE on October 18, 2023, at the KNGC Multi-purpose Hall. It was attended by all faculty members of the college, where Prof. R.C. Patel from the NCTE curriculum core committee as the expert and Prof. C. Nongbri from North-Eastern Hill University as moderator.

ITEP is a four-year integrated programme combining disciplinary and teaching professional education course. It offers dual degrees - B.A.B.Ed or B.Sc.B.Ed and incorporates multidisciplinary learning, Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC), and Value Added Courses (VAC), in alignment with NEP 2020, for all round development and competent of future educators.

The department is supported by qualified and dedicated faculty members who provide academic and personal guidance to student-teachers throughout their course of study. Currently, the ITEP department hosts three batches: the first batch (2023–2027) is in the sixth semester, the second batch (2024–2028) is in the fourth semester, and the third batch (2025–2029) is in the second semester.

## **STRUCTURE OF THE PROGRAM**

The program consists of 8 semesters with a total of 160 credits, distributed across core subjects, electives, skill-based courses, and co-curricular components. ITEP includes the following subjects of study:

1. Major Subjects (Core/Focus Subjects): Students choose a discipline as their primary area of study, which forms the core focus of their degree.
  - a) B.A.B.Ed: Education as First Major
  - b) English/History/Political Science/Economics/Khasi as Second Major (Disciplines)
  - c) B.Sc.B.Ed: Education as First Major
  - d) Physics/Chemistry/Botany/Zoology/Mathematics as Second Major (Disciplines)
2. Minor Subjects (Complementary to Major): Students take a minor subject to complement their major discipline. These subjects provide foundational knowledge and interdisciplinary exposure.
3. Pedagogic Studies
4. Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC)
5. Value Added Courses (VAC)
6. Practicum and School Internship
7. Community Engagement and Service.

## **ADMISSION PROCESS**

(B.A.B.Ed & B.Sc.B.Ed) One unit (50 seats) each:

1. Admissions to the Integrated Teacher Education Program (itep), are strictly based on merit of National Common Entrance Test (NCET) scores.
2. Students are to read the instruction before filling the online application form, Visit [kiangnangbahcollege.ac.in/](http://kiangnangbahcollege.ac.in/) for detailed information and updates.
3. Visit the college website to obtain the application form on payment of Rs. 300/- (Rupees Three Hundred) only.
4. Candidates must submit all required documents, including proof of qualification and identity, at the time of admission.
5. Reservation policies for SC/ST/OBC and other categories are adhered to as per Meghalaya State Government norms.
6. Short-listed candidates are to attend counselling. Physical verification of original certificates/mark sheets, testimonials, printout of the application form along with payment receipt, etc., must be produced during the counselling for verification of furnished information.
7. Pay the admission fee to confirm the admission seat.
8. Orientation sessions will be conducted for newly admitted students to familiarize them with the college culture, facilities, and programs.

**Library:** The Kiang Nangbah Government College Library started functioning right from the inception of the college and has been developing its collection ranging from books, periodicals, reference books, e-journals, magazines and government publications.

At present, the library consists of two main sections viz., a general section and a reference section that span a plethora of reading materials required by the students for their academic and personality development. The Library also encourages the use of Open Access Resources and provided reference and referral services for both students and teachers.

The Library is striving to automate its collection and bring in more technological advancements to effectively and efficiently serve its users and their various needs.



#### **Laboratories**

The college offers well-equipped laboratory facilities to support the practical learning needs of the students. These include science laboratories, psychological laboratory for hands-on learning in educational psychology, computer laboratory to enhance digital skills, etc.



#### **Hostel Facilities**

Kiang Nangbah Government College provides separate hostels for boys and girls with limited seats available. A warden is appointed to oversee hostel activities and address student concerns. Hostel rules must be strictly adhered to, including quiet hours for study and restricted visiting hours.

**Multi-Purpose Hall:**

Kiang Nangbah Government College, Jowai has a Multi-Purpose Hall with a seating capacity of 410 seats equipped with sound systems and attached washrooms for males and females and a vast surrounding area. The Multi-Purpose Hall is located at the heart of the College Campus. College activities, programs and competitions during College Week, NSS programs, Seminars, Workshops, etc., are organized from time to time.

**Sports and Cultural Activities:**

## CO-CURRICULAR AND EXTENSION ACTIVITIES

### National Cadet Corps (NCC)

The college also has a National Cadet Corps (NCC) unit. It offers opportunity for the students to enrol themselves with an aim to train and motivate the youth, provide leadership in all walks of life and be always available for the service of the nation.



### National Service Scheme (NSS)

The college also has a National Service Scheme (NSS) unit. The Motto of the NSS is "NOT ME BUT YOU". The sole aim of the NSS is to provide hands on experience to students in delivering community service and also to train them to have effective leadership skills in their life so as to become efficient leaders and person who are empathetic towards others.

The NSS unit usually conducts two types of activities.

**Regular activities:** Include Cleaning Drives, workshops on personality and leadership development. Awareness program on HIV and Aids and Diabetes. Observance of important national days like International Yoga Day, National unity Day, World Environment Day, International Youth Day, blood donation, training on disaster management, etc.

**Special Camps:** The NSS unit of the college adopts a village and works according to the needs of the people of the village for e.g renovating the village school or organizing programs for the benefit of the village students. Once a village is adopted, the NSS unit will have to work for three years in the adopted village.
